3. CARNEGIE CORPORATION NEW FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

Carnegie Corporation's Board of Trustees in March approved support for a new Fellowship programme in Social Sciences for emerging academics in Ghana, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania and Uganda. The programme has been designed, and will be administered by the Social Science Research Council for an initial two-year period with the possibility of renewal.

The research theme for the programme is peace, security, and development.

Three levels of Fellowships are on offer, all for doctoral work:

- (i)** dissertation proposal development (e.g. for pre-testing a survey instrument or interview protocol)
- (ii)** doctoral research (e.g. to enable fieldwork) and
- (iii)** dissertation writing.

Fellowships are open on a competitive basis to African scholars without Ph.Ds affiliated with a University in Ghana, South African, Tanzania and Uganda. Because of the Corporation's emphasis on developing and retaining the next generation of African academics, priority will be given to applicants who have demonstrated a commitment to a career on the Continent.

Diversity is prized, and women are especially encouraged to apply.

The application deadline for the first round of Fellowships is **31 August, 2011**.

4. DBT-TWAS BIOTECHNOLOGY FELLOWSHIP FOR RESEARCHERS FROM DEVELOPING COUNTRIES.

The Centre for International Co-operation in Science- CICS (Formerly CCSTDS), Chennai, has entered into agreement with the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India for the execution of DBT-TWAS Biotechnology Fellowships for researchers from developing countries.

POSTGRADUATE BIOTECHNOLOGY FELLOWSHIPS

The Department of Biotechnology (DBT) of India and TWAS, the Academy of Sciences for the Developing World are instituting Biotechnology Fellowships for researchers from developing countries who wish to pursue research, leading towards Ph.D in newly emerging areas of biotechnology for which facilities are available in the laboratories/institutes in India. The Fellowship will be tenable in eminent institutes in India.

Candidates from developing countries, such as Asia (other than India)/ Africa/Latin America/ Arab regions with a minimum qualification of Master's degree in Science or Engineering, Medicine or equivalent degree below 30 years are eligible to apply. Duration of the Fellowship will be up to 5 years for Full-time Fellowships (for those willing to register for a PhD in India), and for a minimum period of 12 months and a maximum period of 2 years for sandwich Fellowships (for those already registered for PhD programmes in their home countries).

Selection will be made by a Committee constituted by TWAS. The cost of international travel will be met by TWAS, the Academy of Sciences for the Developing World. Stipend will be provided by DBT to the selected candidates in Indian rupee for the duration of the Fellowship

period. CICS will facilitate the placement of candidates at Universities/ institutes of eminence in India.

POST-DOCTORAL BIOTECHNOLOGY FELLOWSHIPS

The Department of Biotechnology (**DBT**) of India and **TWAS**, the Academy of Sciences for the Developing World, are instituting Biotechnology Fellowships for researchers from developing countries who wish to pursue research in newly emerging areas in Biotechnology at institutes of Excellence in India.

Candidates from developing countries such as Asia (other than India) /Africa /Latin America/Arab region with minimum qualification of PhD in Biosciences or Biotechnology below the age of 40 are eligible to apply. Duration of the Fellowship will be 12-18 months. The candidate should be a regular employee in a developing country and should be holding a research assignment to be undertaken in India.

Selection will be made by a Committee constituted by **TWAS**. The cost of international travel will be met by TWAS, the Academy of Science for the Developing World. Stipends in Indian rupee will be provided to the selected candidates by **DBT** for the duration of the Fellowship period. CICS will facilitate placement of candidates for training in Indian institutes of eminence.
