7. **POWER SUPPLY ON CAMPUS**

In order to ensure improved power supply on the Campus, the commitment of the PHCN has been secured at corporate level, to supply power to the University for 12 hours a day. The arrangement as we were briefed was that the 12 hourly supply will alternate between 12 mid-day and 12 midnight and vice-versa on weekly basis.

The supply from the University Power Station will augment PHCN supply as scheduled below:

7-8am (Daily routine check on generators & refueling)
9-11am Students' Halls of Residence

To be alternated on daily basis between halls in close proximity to the Central Administration and others as indicated below:

Mondays & Wednesdays

Zik, Independence, Queen Idia, Awolowo, Abubakar

Tuesdays and Thursdays

8-10 pm Students' Halls of Residence
10-12 mid-night Residential quarters

Besides, the University has made arrangements to procure additional two units of 2.0 MVA 11kV 50Hz diesel power generators. This means that the current capacity for local generation will be doubled and the hours for which supply is made to different parts of the University community, doubled.
