

INTRODUCTION

- Grantsmanship is the process of obtaining financial grants through grant writing
- Refers to the skills required to secure funding
- For most research grant applications, the process has become increasingly complex
- Highly competitive
 - The idea must be innovative
 - Capable of advancing the current status of knowledge
 - The proposal must be compelling and well-written



GRANT

• To bestow or confer, especially by a formal act, a sum of money or its

equivalent by a government or other organization for a *particular*

purpose

- Research grant: Money given to a researcher for all research expenses,
 to a grant that is limited to only funding certain parts of research
- Synonym: endowment, subvention, award, donation, bursary



TYPES OF GRANTS (1)

- 1. Collaborative Research Grants
 - Usually interdisciplinary, multi-centre and multi-country.
 - Usually led by senior researchers with a team of co-investigators and post-doctoral researchers.
- 2. Fellowships: individual research grants which provide the fellow time to focus on the research grant
- 3. Targeted Grants
 - Early career, Mid-career, Professorial
 - Ring-fenced funding is designed to establish and progress the career of the researcher
- 4. Networking Grants: These are aimed at establishing and developing teams of academic and research collaborators for a particular research topic



TYPES OF GRANTS (2)

- 5. Small Grants- Provide funding support for small research projects or preliminary research which which provide information for larger research projects in future
- 6. Travel Grants: Usually for professional development.
 - Provided by disciplinary specialists e.g. Research Management organization, associations.
 - Support researchers to travel to access resources or opportunities which are not available at their institution.
- 7. Knowledge Transfer Grants or Industrial Partnerships
 - Aimed at promoting collaboration and knowledge exchange between academic and nonacademic collaborators.
 - Funds for proof of concept, pilots, getting new products to the market
- 8. Conference Grants
 - Used to disseminate research findings or host research conferences

PROJECT NARRATIVE

- Most important aspect of the application and basis of assessment of quality, significance, feasibility, and value for money
- Provides the most comprehensive description of the project
- Provides a background to the project, literature review and identifies research gaps
- Contains the research problem and questions/aims and objectives
- Documents the proposed research methods
- Outlines the project management and delivery plan (research team, steering committee, stakeholders, timelines, and deliverables), which may require work packages
- Workplan- Gannt Chart
- Dissemination plan
- Budget and budget justification



LETTERS OF SUPPORT

- Collaborative research involves various partners from other universities, nonacademic organizations, and industry
- Obtained from partners and collaborators
- These partners should provide signed letters of support that indicate the specific contribution of the collaborator and show commitment research project
- Critical points
 - Purpose of research
 - Anticipated outcome from the research project
 - Role in preparing the research proposal
 - Contribution in cash or in-kind
 - Letterheaded, signed, and dated





The potential end users and groups who will benefit should be identified from the proposal writing phase and they should be engaged early



How will the end users and beneficiary groups be engaged e.g., steering committees, regular meetings, dissemination seminars



Activities which will be undertaken to ensure that the project has impact



Must be innovative and creative

TIPS FOR SUCCESSFUL GRANT APPLICATIONS

- Start early
- Apply often
- Read the funding opportunity announcement and confirm that all the requirements are met
- Be succinct and specific
- Be realistic about research goals
- Make sure there are connections between the research questions, objective ,methods, results and dissemination plan



Individual challenges address some of the same problems, but from differing perspectives. Which brings us to these two Grand Challenges that support <u>digital health solutions</u>:






