However, in navigating these challenges, the University has implemented several short-term strategies which include public-private partnerships (PPPs), cost-cutting measures, digitalisation (such as online resources, and e-learning) and various industry collaborations for research.

As Vice Chancellor, I recognise that my role extends beyond leadership to service. My commitment to fostering a culture of academic excellence, innovation, and inclusivity remains unwavering. Moving forward, we have prioritized initiatives that will enhance our academic programmes, support the well-being of our students and staff, and advance our research endeavours. We have continued to strive to create an environment where every member feels valued, empowered, and inspired.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

I am proud to announce that the University of Ibadan has achieved remarkable milestones since the last convocation. This is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our faculty, staff, and students. Permit me to enumerate just a few of the accomplishments.

- Alo Ikeoluwa represented Nigeria at the World Food Forum in Rome, Italy, from October 16 to 20, 2023. The event was hosted by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations. Ikeoluwa was part of the first cohort of the Youth Food Lab incubator programme. Sponsored by the Kingdom of the Netherlands, the programme aimed to empower youth to shape agrifood systems and achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- The Department of Special Education held a Symposium to commemorate the **World Disability Day** at the Trenchard Hall, University of Ibadan on 05 December 2023. The symposium was well attended, and it recorded a resounding success.

- The Department also organised an international conference on special needs education with the theme 'Fostering Holistic Inclusive Educational Services.' The conference was held at the Trenchard Hall, University of Ibadan from 23 to 26 April, 2024.
- ➤ Together with the Servants of Charity in Africa (Opera Guanella) an arm of the Catholic Church, the Department of Special Education organized the Guanella Africa Summit and a Public Lecture on Rehabilitation and Inclusive Basic Education at the Trenchard Hall of the University of Ibadan, on 8 May 2024. The summit was well attended. The event recorded a resounding success.
- Adesinayo Adeyeye, Damilola Alimi, and IreOluwa Ajewole won first, second and third prizes, respectively, in a project competition organised for the Department of mechanical Engineering students.
- ➤ Damilola Yusirat ALIMI emerged as the winner of the Committee of Deans of Engineering & Technology of Nigerian Universities CODET South West Zone II competition with her innovative final-year project on the design and development of a Syringe Infusion Pump. As

- a result of her outstanding achievement, she was nominated to represent the zone at the National competition in August.
- The Department of Aquaculture and Fisheries Management organised a guest lecture and symposium to commemorate the World Fisheries Day. The event, themed "Healthy Ocean Ecosystem and Sustainable Stocks of the Ocean," featured a series of engaging activities. These included a Clean-up Day and Road Show in Ibadan Metropolis on 18 November 2023, followed by the guest lecture and symposium on 21 November 2023.
- Department > The of Wildlife and **Ecotourism** Management celebrated the 2024 World Wildlife Day with a programme tagged: "Connecting People and **Exploring** Digital Innovation Planet: in Wildlife Conservation". The programme took place from 4th to 5th March, 2024.
- ➤ Dr O. O. Oyebola of the Department of Aquaculture and Fisheries Management hosted the 2nd General Assembly of the INCiTiS-FOOD (Integrated and Circular Technologies for Sustainable City Region FOOD Systems)

- in Africa in February 2024, with over twenty EU-AU consortium members in attendance.
- ➤ On Tuesday 25 June 2024, the Department of Wildlife and Ecotourism Management held its 2024 Annual Guest Lecture. It was delivered by Mrs. Susan Akporiaye, former President of the National Association of Nigeria Travel Agencies (NANTA). The lecture was titled: "Tourism Destinations and Products Promotion".
- > The Tree Club (Student Association of Departments of Forest Production and Products & Social Environmental Forestry) hosted the Northern Africa Regional meeting, an annual gathering of members of the International Forestry Students' Association (IFSA) in the Northern African region. There were over 50 participants from Nigeria, Ghana, Morocco, Sierra other countries. The and theme Leone conference was "Harnessing Technology for Sustainable Forestry and Environmental Innovation in Africa".
- ➤ Nathaniel Oluwatobi Owolabi, a 500-Level Student of the Department of Wildlife and Ecotourism Management received a travel grant award of \$500 from Africa Nature Investors (ANI) to attend the 60th

- Annual meeting of the Association of Tropical Biology and Conservation (ATBC) held in July 2024 in Rwanda.
- ➤ Funmilayo Priscilla Etumudon, a 300-Level student of the Department of Forest Production and Products, was awarded the Working to Advance STEM Education in Africa Women (WAAW) Foundation Scholarship for the 2023/2024 session.
- Four 500-Level students (Kehinde Uthman, Ameenat Aderibigbe, Abdullai Molawa Kolade, and Taoffeqoh Bolanle Olasupo) and Two Ph.D. Students (Olufemi Odunayo Komolafe and Rebecca Adepeju Falana) of the Department of Social and Environmental Forestry will participate in the European Union sponsored Erasmus + Student Exchange Internship Programme KA171 at the University of Jean, Spain, from September 2024 to January 2025.
- Omotara Salma (a 500-Level student) and Olamilekan Atanseiye (a 200-Level student) from the Department of Forest Production and Products were among the nine delegates that represented Nigerian chapters of the International Forestry Students' Association (IFSA) at the

- 2023 International Forestry Students' Symposium (IFSS) in Germany.
- Omotara Salma, a 500-Level student, was sponsored as a participant at the Sixth Session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-6). The event took place from February 26th to March 1st, 2024, at the United Nations Environment Programme in Nairobi, Kenya.
- ➤ Omotara Salma was also one of the participants at the Major Group Led Initiative (MGI) in support of the United Nations Forest Forum-19 (UNFF-19). The event took place from 4th to 8th March, 2024, in Nairobi, Kenya.
- ➤ Mr. Nathaniel Owolawi, a 500-Level student from the Department of Wildlife and Ecotourism Management developed an Initiative to interpret the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red-List Categories using short words and illustrations. He also collected data on the birdlife within the Zoological Garden, University of Ibadan, and displayed pictures of the Birds. The project, titled "The Zoo Avian Neighbours," served as an engaging platform to teach the important lesson that wildlife extends beyond enclosures and must be protected wherever they are found. Mr. Owolawi

- also launched another creative project, "Zoo Laughs," further demonstrating his commitment to environmental education and awareness.
- The CEI holds a monthly webinar, with the theme: Entrepreneurship, Innovation and Employability.
- > The CEI also participated in other activities.:
- i. The June 5-6, 2024 HEI Innovation Community of Practice held in Nairobi Kenya, the Director of CEI was one of the panellists at the meeting.
- Fajemirokun Foundation ii. The Oladele Business Innovation and Talent Expression (BITE 2.0), was held on 16 May 2024 at University of Lagos. BITE is an exciting opportunity for aspiring entrepreneurs to showcase their innovative business ideas to a panel of esteemed judges. The sponsor of the competition Oladele Fajemirokun Foundation (OFF) has upgraded this to a competition regional BITE in South-West. The competition will include all Federal universities before the end of 2024, and the University of Ibadan was successfully included in the recent round. The Director CEI was invited as a special Guest of Honour at the event.

iii. The CEI Co-hosted the AT-Swiss Africa Science and Business Innovators Conference, organized by University of Basel between 28 and 29 February 2024. The CEI has been in partnership with University of Basel Switzerland for over 3 years and have been part of their conferences where University of Ibadan students pitched their start-ups.

Victor Durosaro, a 300-level Electrical/Electronic Engineering student, was selected by the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR) to participate in Phase 3 of the Japan-funded Training Programme on "Developing Essential Digital Skills for Women and Youth in Africa: Enhancing Employment Opportunities and Livelihood Development in the Digital Economy." This opportunity was granted on February 8, 2024.

Victor's selection for this prestigious programme was driven by his innovative project focused on transforming agriculture in Nigeria through a Smart Irrigation System. This system is designed to tackle the challenges posed by unpredictable rainfall patterns due to climate change. Victor's proposal introduces a new business

model that not only addresses the irrigation needs of farmers but also seeks to enhance productivity, increase income, and improve nutritional output. His work aims to foster a more resilient and prosperous agricultural future, not only for Nigeria but potentially for the entire African continent.

Medherence, a startup iv. student co-founded by University of Ibadan medical students Nwata Chidinma and Olayiwola Olaitan, was accepted into the prestigious Microsoft for Startups programme. This exciting milestone was achieved on January 29, 2024. Medherence was accepted based on its vision and impact on people with chronic diseases in Nigeria. This opportunity provides the startup with free access to Microsoft product development licenses valued at over \$10,000, along with mentorship from seasoned experts at Microsoft.
