CHARGE TO THE GRADUANDS

I felicitate with and offer hearty congratulations to all the graduands of today. I rejoice with you all for reaching this significant milestone in your pursuit of higher education. The journey indeed has been arduous, yet today you stand triumphant, with hearts bursting with feelings of fulfilment. You have obtained the Doctor of Philosophy in your various disciplines from one of the most reputable universities in the world. In other words, you are philosophers, thinkers and solution providers. The society awaits you to apply your skills to solve the multifaceted challenges that it presently grapples with. I want you to see this as a call to turn your knowledge to expertise and provide the solutions for which the society yearns.

The worth of a University degree is in the industry, learning and character that the holder of that degree displays on a daily basis from the moment of obtaining the degree. It is also in the humane character expressed by the holder in a world that is aching. This is why we cannot overemphasise the importance of your daily conduct once you step out of this hall today. I encourage you to be ethical, humane, and yet courageous in your different professions and field of endeavours.

Remember that University of Ibadan awards her certificates to graduands who have been adjudged to have excelled in character and in learning. You have upon the completion of your Ph.D programmes suddenly become Rising Stars visible for all to see. The world watches you keenly and assesses your action and inaction. People would easily overlook the moral failings of a bachelor's degree holder if such a person displays improper judgement; they might reluctantly overlook the slips of the holder of the degree of Master. However, it would be difficult for them to explain, ignore or pardon the misconduct or improper judgment by the holders of the highest academic degree possible. It is even of greater concern when the degree comes from a University like ours whose generations of graduates have been known for good conduct and sound moral judgement. Our confidence, however, is that anyone who successfully navigated the rigours and demands of doctoral education in the University of Ibadan, should have been endowed with all that it takes to be quintessential and exemplary in every ramification of all that is good and of good report.

OUR STEWARDSHIP

Management has not relented in its efforts to ensure that the University of Ibadan continues to be an avant-garde and a trail blazer in higher education development of the nation. This is the reason the University of Ibadan has been able to retain its position as the pacesetter and University of first choice in training of high level manpower. Our goal is to increase the number of PhD outputs every academic session. Much resources have been invested in our Faculties for quality pedagogy and production of quality researchers, by establishing an enduring academic tradition which we have diligently sustained and consistently enhanced from time to time to meet current world challenges.

With regards to our Undergraduate programmes, I am elated to report to this gathering, that, the Senate of the University has given approval for the creation of two additional Faculties: Faculty of Nursing and Faculty of Computing. Approval also was given for

the Department of Aeronautics and Aerospace Engineering in the Faculty of Technology. The University presented 57 programmes for accreditation out which 54 received full accreditation and 3: Law, Business Education and Crop & Horticultural Science programmes got interim accreditation. The University also presented and got NUC approval to start B. Sc. Social Work, B.Ed Educational Technology, B. Sc. Ed. Computer Science and B.Eng. Biomedical Engineering in the 2025/0226 session. Moving further, we have presented the B. Sc. Pharmacology Programme and four programmes in the Faculty of Computing: B.Sc Software Engineering, B.Sc. Data Science, B. Sc. Cyber Security and B.Sc. Information and Communication Technology to complement the B.Sc Computer Science already available to NUC for Resource Verification, preliminary to accreditation. It is heartening, also, to give information concerning the Completion of Curriculum on Doctor of Business Administration (DBA) at the University of Ibadan School of Business (UISB), approval at Senate and take off of the programme in our Department of Business, Entrepreneurship and Executive Education.

GRADUATION STATISTICS

Your Excellencies, Distinguished Ladies and Gentlemen, on Tuesday 11, Wednesday 12 and Thursday, 13 November, a total of 5,900 graduands received the Bachelor's Degrees in the various disciplines across all our Faculties, the Distance Learning Centre and our Affiliated Institutions, from this, 448 graduated with First Class (Honours). On Friday, 14 and Saturday 15 November, a total of 22 candidates were awarded Master of Philosophy; 2,690 earned academic Degree of Master, while 273 candidates were awarded Professional Degree of Master. In addition to these, 124 Postgraduate Diplomas were awarded. Also, 73 Masters students from PAULESI (Pan African University, Life and Earth Sciences Institute including Health and Agriculture) graduated on Saturday, 15 November, 2025.

Today, 487 candidates, from the various disciplines would be awarded the Doctor of Philosophy degree. The Faculty of Education stands on top of the list with a total of 137 Doctoral graduands, followed by the Faculty of Arts with 72 graduands. The others are:

THE PAN AFRICAN UNIVERSITY LIFE AND EARTH SCIENCES INSTITUTE (PAULESI)

The Pan African University (PAU) is an initiative of African Union aimed at revitalizing higher education, and innovation across Africa. Part of the objectives is to establish world-class graduate Institutions for higher education and research, foster innovation and accelerate Africa's social and economic development. It also aims at producing highly skilled professionals and researchers who can tackle African's developmental challenges. Nigeria is proud to host PAULESI which is allotted to West Africa, and University of Ibadan is elated to have the PAULESI domiciled on its grounds, which is a testament to UI's status as a trailblazer and a globally recognised University. Furthermore, UI is proud that an alumnus and a member of staff, a distinguished Professor of Pharmacognosy in the person of Professor Mubo A.

Sonibare is the incumbent substantive Director of PAULESI. Today, 33 students of the Institute will be awarded Doctor of Philosophy degrees across the various programs of the Institute.

RANKING

In general, inadequate funding continues to pose the greatest challenge to the Nigerian University system and the University of Ibadan is not exempted from this reality. Yet despite this significant challenge, I am pleased to report that our University continues to distinguish itself as the leading Institution in the nation and in West Africa. In the global University rankings, the University of Ibadan has demonstrated progress this year. Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University ranking 2026 published in June 2025 saw UI emerging as the top University in Nigeria. Just in October, the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2026 placed UI as the best (1st) in Nigeria and in the 801–1000 global band, out of 2,191 Universities assessed across 115 countries. The rankings evaluated institutions based on 18 performance indicators grouped under five key categories: *teaching*, *research environment*, *research quality*, *industry engagement*, and *international outlook*.

This achievement attests to the foresight, commitment and hard-work of successive Vice-Chancellors, administrations and staff. It is thus a fitting occasion to extend heartfelt congratulations to the University's dedicated and focused Faculty, Senate, Governing Council and other stakeholders in the University of Ibadan project whose collective efforts have brought about this remarkable success.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT AND WELFARE

Management has remained committed to staff development and welfare, providing financial support to facilitate attendance at local and international conferences, seminars, and workshops.

As a way of motivation to deserving members of staff, meetings of the Appointments and Promotions Committees held regularly from October 2024 till date. A total of one hundred and seventy (170) academic staff were promoted, which was made up of 68 Full Professors,66 Readers, 18 Senior Lecturers and 18 Lecturer Grade I, while a total of three hundred and thirty-eight (338) senior non-academic staff were promoted as well as thirty-two (32) Junior Staff.

STUDENT MATTERS

Distinguished Ladies and Gentlemen, I make bold to say that one area in which we have remained steadfast and uncompromising is in our commitment to imparting knowledge to our students. As a demonstration of the solid knowledge they have acquired, several of our students had received invitations to participate in International competitions, where they had made Nigeria proud and in particular, the University of Ibadan.

The following are some of the heart-warming prowesses achieved by our students.

- Ten undergraduate students from the Faculty of Nursing came first in the Golden Lamp Leadership Initiative African Research Challenge held in September, 2025, while another ten (10) have been selected for the final round of 2025 cycle in Lagos, Nigeria.
- Abigail O. Oyedokun, a 600-Level MBBS student, won the best oral presentation at the Advancing Medical Education Conference held on on 30 March, 2025 in Kigali, Rwanda.
- Ahmed Saheed Olaide, a student from the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine won the World Veterinary Association Global Veterinary Award. He was named Veterinary Student of the Year.
- Adebayo Adewunmi, a 500 Level student of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine has been named one of the twelve recipients across Africa to receive the highly competitive MSD/WDA Veterinary Student Scholarship.
- Miss Temidayo M. Adebisi from the Faculty of Nursing was the recipient of the Data Science Africa fellowship award to Advance Women's Health (DSAWH) for 2025 Cohort.
- Oluwafemi Olajumoke Mercy, a 400 Level Biochemistry student, received the 2024/2025 EOOI Scholarship in the United States of America.
- Gladys FuroDalanbo, an M.Sc Biochemistry student, won a Thomas-Bassir Biomedical Foundation Seed Grant.
- In SAI-powered Distinction Quizathon, organized by FlexiSAF, which drew over 6,000 participants from more than 200 Nigerian tertiary institutions, Daniel Adesanya, a 500-level Petroleum Engineering student, emerged 1st place, securing a №1,000,000 prize, Barnabas Oluwasegun and a 200-level Medicine and Surgery, got the 3rd place and №500,000.
- A 200-level medical student, Abayomi Elijah Olutayo, clinched 2nd place in the National Campus Challenge held on May 10, 2025, with a cash prize of №150,000.
- This year, our team of three students Abdulmuiz Olamilekan ABDULLATEEF, 500 Level Industrial & Production Engineeering; Tijesuni Samuel MOSES, 500 Level

Electrical/Electronic Engineering; and Abdulmumeen Abiodun BALOGUN, Petroleum Engineering, led by Rufus O. Adisa as Instructor emerged as the first prize winner in the Cloud Computing category of the 2024/2025 Huawei ICT Competition Global Final in China. The competition attracted more than 170,000 students from over 2,000 universities and colleges from over 80 countries. More than 160 teams, totaling 470 contestants from 49 different countries and regions. This was no mean accomplishment, given the digital disparity between Africa and the rest of the world.

- Several other students won prestigious fellowships and scholarships from institutions like Harvard, King's College London, and Data Science Africa all within the year 2025.
- Mr Olawale Emmanuel Sunmonu, one of our M. Sc. students was awarded the Presidential Award for outstanding performance during his N.Y.S.C. service to the nation in 2021. He served in Kano State. He was decorated by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu in Abuja on July 29, 2025.
- Our contingent clinched third place at the 2025 FASU 3x3 Basketball Championship in held at Mekerere University, Kampala, Uganda.

We have sustained a cordial and mutually respectful relationship with our students, under the leadership of Mr. Covenant Odedele. On this note, we commend the tireless efforts of the Dean of Students, Professor Demola Lewis and Deputy Dean, Dr. Aiki Raji.

CAMPUS SECURITY

Security challenges have emerged as a major topic of discussion and a significant source of concern over the past years. This underscores why Management has remained resolute and unwavering in its commitment to safeguarding lives and property on the main and other campuses. Among the several methods adopted was enlisting the assistance of the Oyo State Police Command to support the University Security Unit in order to ensure continued safety and security on our campuses.

As a result, incidents of security breaches have significantly declined, and a sense of safety prevails across our campuses. In this regard, we must express our profound appreciation to the Chairman, Council Committee on Security, Professor S. G. Jonathan, for the commendable effort of his committee. The administration is committed to providing the necessary support to the Security Unit to sustain the progress achieved in securing the campuses.

OUR CHALLENGES

In this address, I have highlighted our progress and achievement. However, there are a number of challenges we still contend with as an institution.

One of such challenge is the issue of power supply, as a substantial portion of our resources is expended on powering the University. With the recent developments in the power sector, our monthly electricity bill has more than doubled what it used to be. The University had been categorised as a Band A, user. To mitigate the power challenge, this administration will explore alternative sources of energy. Management has opened communication with the Federal Ministry of Power on this issue. On this quest, I plead with stakeholders to kindly support the University with all means at their disposal.

Other challenges the University grapples with include internet connectivity, maintenance of existing buildings and infrastructure, given the age of University of Ibadan and the growing need for expansion.

I use this platform to appreciate Mr. President for his interventions targeted at revamping Institutions of higher learning. I however passionately plead with Mr. President that the University of Ibadan deserves to be accorded special priority through dedicated reconstruction and rehabilitation funds, along with increased allocations. As the oldest University and a treasured Academic Heritage of all Nigerians, the University of Ibadan deserves a special status that guarantees adequate support and resources to transform it into global destination for academic and intellectual excellence. As the intellectual capital of Nigeria, the University of Ibadan will not relent in continuing to shape and influence development across other Universities.

Mubo Adeola Sonibare is a distinguished Professor of Pharmacognosy. She earned her first degree in Botany, from the prestigious University of Ibadan, Nigeria, in 1992. She subsequently obtained her M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees from the same University of Ibadan in 1996 and 2003, respectively. Professor Mubo Sonibare specializes in Biodiversity Conservation and Medicinal Plants Research, with expertise in plant tissue culture, standardization, and molecular authentication of medicinal plants.

Prof. Sonibare has over twenty-nine (29) years of teaching and research experience at the university level and has held several administrative positions and served on various committees at the University of Ibadan. Additionally, she served as the Head of the Department of Pharmacognosy and the Programme Coordinator for PAULESI's Master of Science in Medicinal Plants Research and Drug Development from 2020 to 2024.

Prof Sonibare delivered the University of Ibadan 497th Professorial Inaugural Lecture on July 29, 2021, titled "Quest for Sustainable Health Care Provision: Utilization and Misutilization of Our Co-Tenants". Professor Sonibare has received numerous Fellowships including a Research Fellowship at Koishikawa Botanic Gardens, Graduate School of Science, University of Tokyo, Japan (2002), Georg Forster Research fellowship by Alexander von Humboldt Foundation

(2008-2009), University of Ibadan Senate Research Grant, TWAS-UNESCO Associate to University of Botswana, Gaborone, Botswana, Georg Forster Research fellowship further research stay at Jacobs University, Bremen, Germany, Institution Based Research (IBR) TETFUND Grant, Research Group Linkage Programme award by AvH, Germany, DIES International Deans Course award, Germany. She is an active member of many academic and professional bodies, including the Nigerian Society of Pharmacognosy, Botanical Society of Nigeria, American Society of Plant Taxonomists (ASPT), Science Association of Nigeria, Academic Society of Functional Foods and Bioactive Compounds. She has served in various leadership capacities, such as the Assistant General Secretary of the Nigerian Society of Pharmacognosy (NSP) and Vice Coordinator of the University of Ibadan branch of the Organization for Women in Science for the Developing World (OWSD). Currently, she serves as the Editor-in-Chief of the Nigerian Journal of Natural Products and Medicine.

Prof. Sonibare is a reviewer of several local and international journals and has served as an external examiner and assessor at the Professorial level for various universities within and outside Nigeria. She has supervised numerous undergraduate and M.Sc. projects and has successfully supervised ten PhD students. Professor Sonibare has made significant contributions to her field, having over 140 articles published in both local and international peer-reviewed journals. She is happily married to Oluwatayo Olatunde Sonibare, a distinguished professor of Organic Geochemistry and the marriage is blessed with three wonderful children.

Professor Mubo A. Sonibare assumed duty as the 3rd substantive Director of the Institute on Monday, 14 April 2025.

5.0 Institutional Milestones and Progress

With the assumption of office by the new Director, the Institute has witnessed remarkable transformation across its academic, administrative and research fronts. These achievements reflect a renewed commitment to excellence, innovation and institutional growth. The following developments highlight the progress recorded under the new leadership:

- 2) Comprehensive Curriculum Review: In line with our drive for academic relevance, PAULESI has embarked on a comprehensive curriculum review of all programmes. This process ensures that our curricula remain responsive to emerging scientific trends, societal needs, and the goals of the African Union's Agenda 2063. The updated curricula will emphasize sustainability, innovation, and entrepreneurship.
- 3) Development of a Robust Research Agenda: The Institute is advancing a structured research agenda aligned with the African Union's Agenda 2063 and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), aimed at addressing critical challenges across Africa's life and earth sciences, including health and agriculture. The overall goal of the PAULESI research agenda is to contribute significantly to the development of Africa through high quality research, capacity building, and knowledge dissemination. By achieving these goals, PAULESI aims to play a leading role in transforming higher education and research in life and earth sciences on the continent.

- 4) Leadership Development: PAULESI's collaboration with inspLIFT Global led to a three-day leadership and human capacity development training program. The program was designed to strengthen leadership skills at various levels, focusing on emotional intelligence, supervisory skills, and conflict management. This helps build the capable institutions and transformative leadership needed to achieve Agenda 2063's goals.
- 5) Investing in Human Capital: PAULESI's very existence, as a center for high-level education and research, aligns with Agenda 2063's goal for a skills revolution underpinned by science, technology, and innovation. By providing quality education and training to African students, PAULESI is nurturing the continent's most valuable resource—its human capital. The institute's AU Club, in collaboration with PAULESI staff, organized educational campus tours which has helped to promote a people-driven development that includes youth and community engagement.
- 6) Agricultural Development: PAULESI's new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Society of Underutilized Legumes in 2025 demonstrates a commitment to research and development of underutilized crops. This aligns with Agenda 2063's goal of Modern Agriculture and the African Commodity Strategy flagship project, which seeks to add value to African commodities.
- 7) Strengthened Relationship with the Host University: Our partnership with the University of Ibadan, our esteemed host institution, has grown stronger. We continue to enjoy robust academic collaboration, shared facilities, and mutual support in research and training. We remain grateful to the University management for their unwavering cooperation and goodwill.
- 7) Introduction of Student Forum: A platform that fosters open dialogue, feedback and engagement between students and management. Through this forum, students have been able to voice their concerns, contribute ideas and stay informed about developments within the Institute. Many issues that could have disrupted the learning environment have been resolved through constructive communication, demonstrating our shared commitment to continuous improvement.

6.0 Entrepreneurship and Innovation

The institute launched a comprehensive Incubation Program to empower students with the skills, knowledge, and network to turn their ideas into reality. This program includes design thinking sessions, entrepreneurship training, and business development support, with the ultimate goal of starting businesses and generating income. This directly supports the Agenda 2063 goal of Transformed Economies and Job Creation.

7.0 **Pan-African Collaboration**

Late in 2024, PAULESI hosted the first-ever Pan African University (PAU) International Conference, where scholars from all PAU institutes shared research findings and innovations. This event fostered intellectual engagement and multidisciplinary collaborations, which are crucial for continental integration. The institute's student body, which includes individuals from across Africa, already serves as a "melting pot of African cultures," promoting the pan-African dimension articulated in Agenda 2063. The conference created a platform for knowledge sharing and intellectual interactions among PAU scholars, which is fundamental to building a knowledge-based economy across Africa.

8.0 Community Engagement and Outreach

PAULESI mission extends beyond the walls of academia. As part of our community engagement efforts, PAULESI organised a STEM Showcase for 200 senior secondary school

students from selected schools within the Ibadan metropolis on Friday, 17 October 2025. This initiative aimed to ignite curiosity, inspire innovation and encourage young minds to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The enthusiasm and brilliance displayed by these students reaffirm our belief in the transformative power of outreach and mentorship.

9.0 State of the Art Laboratory

The fully functional Molecular Biology and 3D Laboratories serve as vital centres for advanced research and innovation. The Molecular Biology Lab supports DNA analysis, gene sequencing, and postgraduate research collaborations, while the 3D Lab enables modelling, simulation, and prototype printing. Together, they strengthen PAULESI's capacity for cutting-edge, interdisciplinary research and learning.

10.0 Academic Excellence and Student Achievements

The Institute has made remarkable progress in integrating technology into teaching and learning. The adoption of e-learning platforms and digital resources has broadened access to knowledge, making learning more flexible, interactive, and student-centred. These efforts are part of our broader vision to prepare graduates who are not only knowledgeable but also adaptable, creative, and globally competitive.

PAULESI is witnessing a remarkable surge in student-led research and publications, a clear indicator of the vibrant academic culture within our institute.

11.0 Challenges

While we celebrate our milestones, we must also acknowledge the challenges that have tested our resolve. Like many institutions, we have grappled with limited funding, infrastructural needs and the demands of maintaining quality in a fast-evolving academic environment. The global economic realities have presented additional hurdles, affecting both staff and students.
