




Unlocking Progress: The Indispensable Trio of Security, Governance, and Citizen Responsibilities

Nigeria's Security Challenges



- **Boko Haram Insurgency:** Since 2009, over 36,000 deaths and displacement of 2.5 million people in the Northeast (Source: Council on Foreign Relations).
 - **Economic Impact:** An estimated \$9 billion in damages and losses, hindering regional development.

- **Farmer-Herder Conflicts:** Contributed to decreased agricultural productivity and increased food insecurity
- Banditry and kidnapping

Global Examples

- **Colombia:** Post-peace agreement with FARC rebels in 2016 led to a 4.5% GDP growth in 2017.
- **Singapore:** Ranks among the safest countries globally, attracting multinational corporations and boosting its GDP per capita to over \$65,000. Low crime rates attract FDI inflows of \$92 billion in 2020 (UNCTAD). Strong security measures contribute to a stable economy.

Intelligence gathering and monitoring to pre-empt threats.


Military Coordination

Challenges of Governance in Nigeria

- **Corruption Perception:** Ranked 150 out of 180 countries in 2022 by Transparency International.
 - **Economic Losses:** Corruption costs Nigeria approximately \$18 billion annually (Source: UNODC).
 - **Infrastructure Deficits:** Only about 60% access to electricity; inadequate healthcare and education services.

Prioritize National Interests


Place the interest of Nigeria above personal or sectional interests in decision-making and actions.
