By graduating from the University of Ibadan, you have not only earned a degree; but also, you have gained a decisive head start in life. # THE LEGACY OF A PREMIER INSTITUTION

The University of Ibadan holds a unique and cherished place in the heart of our nation. Founded in 1948 as University College Ibadan and initially affiliated with the University of London, we became a full-fledged independent University in 1962, establishing ourselves as Nigeria's first

degree-awarding Institution. From these modest beginnings, we have grown into one of the most prestigious Universities in Africa.

Our alumni network has made indelible contributions to Nigeria's academic, political, industrial, economic, and cultural development. Our graduates have served as Presidents, Governors, Ministers, Captains of Industry, Renowned Academics, Religious Leaders and Cultural Icons. The history and influence of the University of Ibadan have made it a beacon of intellectual leadership and a symbol of national pride.

### EXPANDING FRONTIERS OF KNOWLEDGE AND ACCESS

From our early days of offering programs only in Arts, Science, and Medicine, we have evolved into a comprehensive citadel of learning with over 130 academic departments organized into 23 Faculties and Institutes and two (2) Colleges. Our recent establishment of the Faculty of Computing, positions us at the forefront of digital innovation, preparing our students for the demands of the 21st-century economy, also, our Department of Nursing has metamorphosed into a full-ledged Faculty. In addition, Senate has given approval for the take-off of the Department of Aeronautics and Aerospace in the Faculty of Technology.

Our Postgraduate College remains the flagship of postgraduate education in Nigeria and one of the largest in Africa, producing the highly skilled human resources required not only for the Nigerian University System but for the world. With a current student enrolment ratio of 60% postgraduate to 40% undergraduate, we are steadily advancing towards our vision of becoming a fully postgraduate-focused institution.

Our robust Open and Distance Learning Centre (ODLC), with a population of over ten thousand learners per level, increases access to quality education and human capacity building. It currently runs sixteen programs across six Faculties. We are also proud to host the Pan African University Life and Earth Sciences Institute on behalf of the West African sub-region. This African Union initiative attracts students from across the continent, reinforcing our role as a hub for continental collaboration and academic excellence.

Our vision is clear: to be a world-class institution for academic excellence geared towards meeting societal needs. In fulfillment of this mandate, the University of Ibadan is consistently ranked among the most prestigious universities globally and, very recently, as the best in Nigeria according to Times Higher Education World University Rankings for 2025/2026. Significantly, sixty-five of our scientists have been recognized among the top 2% globally by

the prestigious Stanford/Elsevier Ranking, underscoring our unwavering commitment to research and scholarship.

Permit me to reaffirm our University's commitment to academic excellence, inclusivity and relevance. We remain steadfast in our commitment to strengthening our curriculum, expanding our research capacity and improving our facilities so that our graduates can remain competitive on the global stage. We will also continue to intensify our efforts to deepen partnerships with industry and civil society to ensure that learning leads to meaningful careers, innovative entrepreneurship and lasting social impact. Above all, we shall continue to safeguard our campus culture where diversity is respected, merit is rewarded and every student and staff member can thrive.

# A SHOWCASE OF MILESTONES: SOARING ON EAGLES' WINGS

### IN STUDENT EXCELLENCE

- Ten undergraduate students from the Faculty of Nursing came first in the Golden Lamp Leadership Initiative African Research Challenge held in September, 2025.
- 2024/2025 EOOI Scholarship in the US for Oluwafemi Olajumoke Mercy, a 400-level student of the Department of Biochemistry.

- Abigail O. Oyedokun, a 600-Level MBBS student, won the best oral presentation at the Advancing Medical Education Conference held on on 30 March, 2025 in Kigali, Rwanda.
- Miss Temidayo M. Adebisi from our Faculty of Nursing was the recipient of the Data Science Africa fellowship award to Advance Women's Health (DSAWH) for 2025 Cohort.
- Fajemiyo Ayomide, Folaju Favour, and Oluwasayo Jesulolufemi (all 400-Level students in the Department of European Studies) won scholarships for the 'Summer with Pushkin for Russian Language Students in CIS States and Africa' program in Moscow, which ran from 24 August to 6 September 2025.
- The student body of the Department of English under the aegis of NASELS (NATURAL DONATION OF STUDENTS OF ENGLISH) UI Chapter, held a programme tagged TED-Style Talk Session where they hosted professionals in Journalism, Broadcasting, Tourism, Music to expand students' awareness.
